How to apply



Candidates submit an application through UCAS. The UCAS website has extensive information about how to apply and what to include on your form.

Staff from our accredited partners check all applications to ensure candidates fulfil the minimum entry requirements for School Direct.

Applicants who are shortlisted for interview will be invited to spend a full day at Mascalls Academy or at one of our partner schools. During the day interviewees will be observed teaching a short lesson to a group of pupils, will complete our literacy, numeracy and subject knowledge tests and have a formal interview. You will be informed in advance about the content of the lesson, the age group and the abilities of the pupils you will be teaching. Opportunities will be provided for you to meet experienced teachers from your phase/subject area and other trainee teachers. A representative from our accredited provider may be involved throughout the day and the selection decision will be a joint decision between Mascalls Training Partnership and the accredited provider.

Candidates will be informed via the UCAS Teacher Training website as to whether they have been made a conditional offer.

Offers of a training place will be dependent on DBS disclosures, successful completion of the statutory numeracy and literacy tests and, for candidates awaiting degree results, the classification of their degree.

What we are looking for in our trainees



We are looking for ambitious, forward-thinking, emotionally intelligent and innovative trainee teachers who are passionate and enthusiastic about teaching and learning and the prospect of working with young people of all abilities in a school environment. As a member of the teaching team you will be eager to learn how to

deliver outstanding

lessons and contribute to the wider education agenda; inspiring learners and raising standards across all areas of school life.

The desire to work with young people will be demonstrated by having had meaningful work experience with young people of school age. This could be paid work or voluntary work and may include, for example, being a teaching assistant, a cover supervisor, a youth leader, coaching a sport's team, a Guide or Scout leader. You should also have completed some experience of working or observing in a classroom in a primary and/or secondary school setting.

*In order to embark on any of our teacher training programmes you will need to have graduated ideally with a 1st or 2.1 degree. For primary teaching your degree can be in any subject but for secondary it should be relevant to your chosen subject area. You must also have GCSEs at grade C or above (or equivalent) in Maths and English (and Science for primary courses) and have passed the Professional Skills Tests.

Created to offer experience in both KS2 and KS3 you will experience high quality training that will enable you to teach in either the primary or secondary sector in the future. This training programme leads to a QTS or a PGCE qualification that is accredited by Canterbury Christ Church University. This is a fantastic opportunity to experience training in both the primary and secondary sector. Trainees spend the majority of the first two terms in a primary school followed by two terms in a secondary school before choosing which Key Stage you wish to specialise in.

In collaboration with local primary schools Mascalls Training Partnership will provide a fantastic, unique school based learning opportunity leading to a qualification that is accredited by **Canterbury Christ Church University (CCCU).**

Secondary training overview

- Secondary trainees will follow a training programme for a qualification that is accredited by Kent and Medway Training.
- Trainees following the School Direct training programme have the option of working towards a PGCE that is validated by the University of Brighton.
- Trainees on the School Direct Salaried route work towards QTS but may have the opportunity to also study for a PGCE (this will incur a tuition fee).
- Prior to joining Mascalls Academy trainees will attend two induction days - one with KMT and one at Mascalls Academy.
- You will spend 4 1/2 days a week training at Mascalls Academy and 1/2 day a week will be dedicated to further professional development sessions at KMT.
- You will have a 4-6 week contrasting placement in a second school, this is usually in term 4.
- You will develop your skills as a teacher through a comprehensive and rigorous CPD programme.

*with the exception of PE which is QTS only
