

## Revised SIXTH FORM Dress Code (2017)

### SIXTH FORM DRESS CODE

In the Sixth Form, students have their own dress code, which should be smart and within the ethos of the school. In interpreting the guidelines, students should ensure that their overall appearance is appropriate to a working environment.

#### MALE:

- Trousers, Chinos, Black Jeans (not faded with no rips)
- Tailored shorts are allowed in summer (not tracksuit material or blue denim/rips, as above)
- Shirts, smart polo shirts, polo necks, smart jumpers. (No hoodies or **large** logos)
- Round neck t-shirts can be worn as an undershirt.
- Ties are optional.
- Clean shoes/boots in any colour. No trainers or canvas shoes.

#### FEMALE:

- Skirts/dresses (No higher than 6" above the knee) – Leather and black denim is permissible
- Trousers, black jeans or jeggings (not faded with no rips) Thin leggings are NOT permitted unless under a dress/long jumper.
- Tailored shorts (not tracksuit material or blue denim/rips, as above)
- Blouses, shirts or smart tops, jumpers, cardigans. Sleeveless tops are allowed but no thin/spaghetti straps or visible bra straps. No low cut tops.
- Clean shoes/boots in any colour. No trainers or canvas shoes. Heels should be an appropriate height to be able to move around with ease.

#### UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

This would include:

- Sheer, low-cut or spaghetti straps
- No midriffs showing
- No indecent shorts/hotpants
- No hats in lessons
- No large brand names or logos
- No hoodies
- No tracksuits
- No trainers including converse, skater shoes, etc,
- No Ugg boots or flip-flops
- No ripped clothing

Clothing for specific lessons such as PE, Art and dance is acceptable but a change of clothes should be brought and worn if other lessons are timetabled for that day.

**Most students meet our expectations, but those who do not conform will be sent home to remedy the problem or if this is not possible will spend the day in the Student Referral Centre.**
