Sixth Form life and study is very different from your earlier years of education. Many students maintain that it is completely different from their previous experiences of schooling. The most distinct change is the relationship with teachers who can relate to you more as an individual and help to support and guide you in highly personalised ways. There is still a strong focus on tracking your achievement and monitoring your progress, with intervention as needed.

In addition to your studies, there will be a number of opportunities for you, as a young adult, to develop leadership and study skills, as well as undertake work experience. Sixth Form students are actively encouraged to become involved in mentoring, as well as voluntary, and extra-curricular activities that support your onward career and Higher Education aspirations.

Sixth formers enjoy many privileges and are highly regarded by the staff and students in the school for their contributions to the school community. The highest accolade a student can receive is being elected by the Principal and Head of Sixth Form to become a Senior Prefect or Head Student - a very rewarding role with many areas of responsibility.

We have a dedicated Sixth Form Common Room which is designed for rest, recuperation and socialising, as well as a work space. There is a canteen run by the school catering company offering students the opportunity to purchase breakfast items in the morning, hot and cold drinks, sandwiches and hot meals throughout the day. In addition we have quiet study areas, a Sixth Form ICT suite and study rooms enabling students to use their non-contact lessons productively. Additionally, all of our students are provided with a Chromebook and we use the Google Suite to set work and to share lesson materials with students.

Head Students

Each year we encourage our Year 13 students to apply for the role of 'Head Student' which requires them first to submit a formal letter of application and then participate in an interview with the Principal and Head of Sixth Form.

This year's successful candidates will be available at our Open Evening to talk about their journey through Mascalls and will outline the support they have received from teachers and support staff to strive for their future goals.

Your Pathways

To be successful, students need to choose the right course for them. At Mascalls Academy Post 16, we offer a range of vocational and academic courses to suit all Level 3 learners. We encourage our students to research the possible choices open to them prior to submitting an application.

Pathway	
The Academic Pathway	This pathway will require you to study three A-Level courses. The minimum entry requirements for this pathway are five 5-9 grades, including English Language and Maths.
The Blended Pathway	This pathway will give you the choice of studying a mixture of A-Level and vocational based subjects. The minimum entry requirements for this pathway are five 4-9 grades, including English Language and Maths.
The T-Level Pathway	This pathway will see you combine classroom learning with 'on-the-job' experience. The entry requirements for this pathway are five 5-9 grades including English, Maths and Science and will include external placement with an approved provider.
GCSE English and Maths resits	Students who have not yet gained a grade 4 in either English Language or Maths will be required to attend resit lessons to help them achieve their full potential. These tailored lessons are also offered to students looking to improve their grade, and are timetabled on a weekly basis.



The curriculum offer at Mascalls Academy Post-16 comprises of a combination of A Level and Applied General (BTEC/OCR/RSL) options, offering students an excellent range of traditional academic subjects, alongside Vocational Level 3 qualifications that develop practical skills and knowledge related to an employment area. Many students choose a combination of the two, enjoying the slightly different study approaches to work and assessment. In addition this year we are launching our new T-Level qualification in Health.

Students are encouraged to make applications for 3 A-Levels or equivalents over a two year programme (4 A-Levels can be selected by students who achieve significantly at GCSE). As all A-Level subjects are examined by summative assessments at the conclusion of the course it is necessary for us to periodically assess student progress through prepublic exams (PPE) or 'mocks'. The PPEs conducted at the end of Year 12 will be used to forecast grades for UCAS applications and therefore should be given due focus for revision and preparation. Support is offered to students who require it and we offer interventions, holiday revision sessions and Period 6 sessions (3-4pm) where necessary to ensure students gain quality grades on completion of their time with us.

Students taking BTEC/OCR/RSL subjects should be aware that they are a two year programme of study and students will need to complete Year 13 in order to gain a full qualification. Students must therefore progress sufficiently in their other Year 12 subjects, to ensure Year 13 entry. Additionally, these qualifications have exam and/or controlled assessment elements.

As a school, we work closely with students in Year 11 to determine the best programme of study to meet individual needs alongside our curriculum offer. This is done through regular assemblies and careers guidance meetings with individuals as needed. For internal applicants we have the MAS11 website which should be used as a resource for regular updates on the process of application shared by Mr Stamato.

T-Levels are a new type of course which have been developed in collaboration with employers, providing a balance of classroom learning and real-world experience following completion of GCSEs. One T-Level runs for 2 years and is equivalent to three A-Levels.

T-Levels are a technical option designed to meet the needs of industry and prepare students aged 16-19 for work, future training or study. Depending on their T-Level of choice, students will find that 80% of their time is spent onsite at their academy in either a classroom, laboratory or workshop environment gaining the skills that employers need. The other 20% of their time will be spent gaining meaningful onthe-job experience through an industry placement where they can put these skills into action.

For students T-Levels provide valuable experience in the workplace. For employers T-Levels provide an opportunity to see and support new talent within their industry first-hand.

Although T-Levels may seem similar to apprenticeships, they do differ quite significantly. If a student chooses to become an apprentice they will typically focus on learning a particular role, and will spend 80% of their time in the workplace and 20% in the classroom – the exact reverse of a T-Level.

An apprentice is employed, and will be paid for their time at work whereas the majority of T-Level placements will be unpaid.

A-Levels are an academic option which typically leads on to further study at university or college. Similar in style to GCSEs, A-Levels are entirely classroom based.

The benefits of studying T-Levels include:

- Industry-specific technical knowledge and practical skills
- A minimum of 45 days' placement in a student's chosen industry or occupation
- Common workplace skills
- Industry-specific technical knowledge and practical skills

What courses do we offer?

T-Level Health

Health Students will develop the core knowledge and skills that are needed for entry to a range of health occupations, including working within the health and science sector, principles of good scientific and clinical practice, and biology and anatomy.

Work Experience & Character Development

In the Spring of Year 12, students will undertake a work experience placement to support their university or career plans. Historically, students have gained places within a huge variety of establishments, including hospitals, emergency services, media, law, engineering, education and the arts. In addition we have access to online provision through the NHS and other providers nationally as we are conscious that post-Covid the working environment looks very different for many businesses. Mascalls Academy places great emphasis on the importance of careers education, information, advice and guidance, and in the Sixth Form, students are given full support on making university and job applications, including UCAS and career related workshops and events throughout their two years with us.

Students are expected to complete one hour weekly sessions entitled 'Character Development' that engage them with wider research into onward progression. All students have a Unifrog account that allows them to track their progress in this and encourages them to build their personal statements and make note of possible applications.

This programme ensures that students are working towards, and thinking of, their career options beyond Year 13, and provides relevant activities to improve their understanding and application of work-based skills. It will help students apply knowledge, skills and understanding that are current and useful for both learners and potential employers, and have been designed specifically to support employability.

We also encourage students to undertake MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses) to both complement aspects of their studies that have interested them but also to cite as relevant research ahead of onward study at undergraduate level. For more information visit either mooc.org or futurelearn.com.

Sixth Form advisory groups are organised into 10 groups of between 20-25 students; 5 in Year 12 and the same in Year 13. Each year group receives PSHE and mentoring appropriate to their chosen pathways, personal development, and individual interests during their time with us. Students will engage with a variety of topics and activities in a comprehensive programme which includes a specific focus on how to cope with the challenges of Post-16 study through developing an A-Level Mindset.

Advisory takes place at the start of every day (8.30am-9.00am with the exception of Wednesdays when Year 12 students are permitted to work from home for the day) for registration, and to ensure students have regular contact with their Advisor so that any issues can be addressed immediately. This time also provides the opportunity for effective mentoring to be conducted in a one-to-one environment, ensuring personalised support and guidance can be offered to each and every Sixth Form student.


The move from GCSE to A Level study is a challenging one and there is no direct link between success at the end of Year 11 and success at A level. Instead, the factors which determine students' A Level success are their habits, routines, attitudes and approaches to study.

As part of the personal development programme we provide for students, we have embedded the work of Steve Oakes and Martin Griffin's VESPA model, which focuses on five key elements of success. Their research into the A level Mindset underpins all of the work we do to support learners in making significant progress towards the performance they are aiming for. Therefore, we coach students to address and strengthen the following behaviours and characteristics alongside their subject content.

- V = Vision they know what they want to achieve.
- E = Effort they put in many hours of proactive independent study.
- S = Systems they organise their learning resources and time.
- P = Practice they practise and develop their skills.
- A = Attitude they respond constructively to setbacks.

We are dedicated to ensuring that all students are well supported both academically and pastorally during their time with us. To ensure this we have in place, both a Head of 6th Form and a Deputy whose role is to support the year group, promote quality engagement, celebrate success and maintain communication between school and home. In addition, we also have a full-time non-teaching support assistant who is based in the office situated in proximity to the Common Room and is available throughout the day and can be contacted by parents at any time.

Parent Consultation Evenings typically take place twice throughout the academic year and offer an opportunity to find out how your son or daughter is getting on with their academic work. Additionally, parents may be contacted by teachers if concerns arise regarding academic progress or to celebrate achievement.

In a fully integrated Sixth Form, students also have ample opportunities to become involved in a wide range of social, community and in-school activities. Students can take on extra responsibilities as a Prefect or Head Student, organise whole school events, raise funds for a wide range of charities and act as ambassadors for the school on public occasions.

Volunteering also forms a key part of the Year 12 experience, and we offer a range of supportive opportunities that students can undertake. These include Sports Coaches, Reading Mentors, Librarians and Learning Support Assistants.

Careers Advice

The possibility for future employment can be vast and daunting for young people in today's society. We aim for our students to be competitive applicants who perform impressively at interviews, enabling them to access the job of their choosing. At Mascalls Academy, we have a proud tradition of quality careers advice which seeks to ensure students are given the opportunity to explore different career paths and research desirable characteristics required by future employers.

There is opportunity throughout the two year programme to interact with real employers who are part of a network of volunteers who come into schools to offer practical advice on interview techniques and tips for making successful applications. The Heads of Year and Head of Sixth Form are part of the process of supporting students in making choices about their future and will be on hand to give guidance and advice, as well as completing references for successful applicants.

The Application Process

When making your application, it is important that you research your options carefully - discuss the subjects that you are interested in with teachers and your family. Find out which type of course would be the most suitable for you: the more examination based subjects or the subjects which offer an equal balance between examination and coursework.

We encourage applicants to submit an application to us by February 2024, however we do accept applications throughout the academic year. Please apply online via Admissions+ at mascalls.applicaa. com. As part of our application process, applicants will be invited to attend a meeting where a member of the Post 16 team will discuss your strengths and help you to make the right choices.





We will be holding our Open Evening on the 9th of November 2023 to offer an opportunity to hear more about the 6th Form and to interact with our teachers regarding the range of subjects that we offer. At this event there will be a talk from the Head of 6th Form and an opportunity to tour the school. We would encourage you to come along, even if you have been at the school since Year 7.

All internal students making applications will receive information via assemblies and on the MAS11 Google Classroom that has been set up to support the process by Mr Stamato, Assistant Principal in charge of Year 11. Where required, informal meetings may be held to discuss applications or discuss subject choices. These will take place in March and April.


Please note that where English and/or Maths GCSE has not been achieved at Level 4, students will be required to continue with the study of either/both as appropriate, until this level (or alternative stepping stone qualification) is met. However, providing that other entry criteria is met this does not preclude the study of Level 3 courses. Each student's application is considered on a case by case basis.

Entry conditions are published on our website at the beginning of each application year, and further details can be found on the individual Subject Information Sheets that are available on our website. External applicants may be invited to attend a Sixth Form External Applicants' event, at which they would have a short discussion with a member of the Sixth Form team to discuss their application; have an opportunity to meet current Sixth Form students and tour the facilities.

For all applicants, we hold an induction programme each year, which takes place at the school towards the end of the summer term (June/July). Information about this will be posted on our website after the Easter holiday. We have a high expectation that all serious candidates will attend the induction programme, during which time students will participate in "taster" lessons in all of their proposed subjects, attend study skills sessions and undertake preparatory Sixth Form orientation. Work for all subjects will be set for completion over the summer and formally assessed in September.

All places offered are conditional upon GCSE grades and are issued in line with our published Admissions Policy. Ultimately, however, the key criteria is that the student is able to achieve success and benefit from the courses they have chosen.

*Please note that late applications will be considered provided that an application is submitted to the Sixth Form Support Assistant via mascalls.applicaa.com and evidence of GCSE grades achieved is provided.
